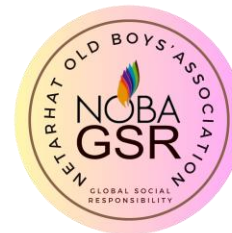

Sangini impact journey. It started with talented Asmi and her mother Paramita duo performance.

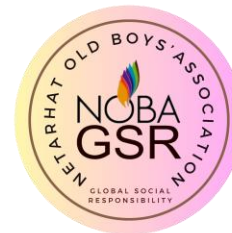

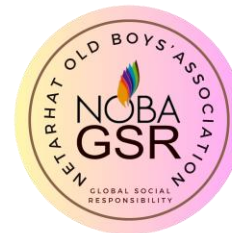

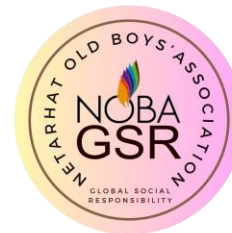
